WACOSA Title VI Policy Statement

Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended provides:

"No person shall on the grounds of race, color, or national origin, sex, age, and handicap/disability, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance." The Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987 amended Title VI to specify that entire institutions receiving Federal funds – whether schools, and colleges, government entities, or private employers – must comply with Federal civil rights laws, rather than just the particular programs or activities that receive the funds.

Making a Title VI complaint

Any person who believes he/she/they have been aggrieved by an unlawful discriminatory practice under Title VI may file a complaint with WACOSA. Any such complaint must be in writing and filed with WACOSA within 180 days following the date of the alleged discriminatory occurrence.
